# Interview with Kai Schlaudraff, MD ISAPS Treasurer

ISAPS is governed by a Board of Directors, with the support of various Committees, National Secretaries, and an ISAPS Executive Staff who work together to organize, collaborate, and deliver ISAPS projects and activities.

Our leaders are essential to who we are and serve as chief advocates in helping us maintain our esteemed presence in the specialty as global leaders in aesthetics.

One of these leaders is our Treasurer, Dr. Kai Schlaudraff. We are fortunate to have had him on our leadership team for quite some time, and he brings a wealth of experience and insight to our Society. We had the opportunity to meet with him recently and hear what he has to share regarding his role and his perspective on our specialty.

ISAPS: In all your years of being an essential figure at ISAPS, what have been some of your biggest successes and accomplishments?

SCHLAUDRAFF: In 2012 I joined the Board of ISAPS as

Assistant Treasurer after having been the local host for the Biennial meeting in Geneva. Then, as its Treasurer, I started to structure its finances and to work on the governance side of ISAPS. At that time, ISAPS was in a financially healthy but in a fragile state since it would not have been able to continue its operations if one Biennial congress had to be canceled. We experienced this scenario during the COVID-19 pandemic and ISAPS did not only survive but quickly developed and financed webinars and other online education initiatives and served its members well during this crisis – thanks to its restructured finances. For this, I focused on financial transparency through audits, implemented financial policies, introduced measures for cost reduction, and diversified income sources.

Today, I am proud to say that at the end of my term as Treasurer, **the ISAPS finances are the strongest ever** – and that future investments into new educational platforms like the integration of AI into ISAPS can be financed.

In terms of other accomplishments, I had within ISAPS, is the establishment of the **Global Alliance Partners** Program of national societies of plastic surgery. This past December we held our first Global Alliance Meeting in London with national society leaders from all over the world.

I am also overseeing the **ISAPS Revision Insurance Program**, which is now available in the UK, South Africa, many European countries, and the United States, and continues to expand.

Additionally, I created the <u>ISAPS Global Sponsorship</u> <u>Program</u> which is the third largest revenue generator for ISAPS and a great platform to shape the future of our specialty with our industry partners.

Finally, as part of the <u>Journal Operations Committee</u>, we managed the successful transition to a new editor and the modernization of the publishing model altogether.

ISAPS: As a specialist in aesthetic, plastic, and reconstructive surgery, what procedure has made the most progress over the past year regarding results, and how has technology influenced this?

SCHLAUDRAFF: High-definition ultrasound liposculpture, fat grafting, and stem cell science have developed significantly. We are learning more about "fat as a tissue", its regulation through Aregs, and its numerous functions in the body. It is the most abundant source of stem cells and offers to us the possibility to use not only the cells but also their exosomes (the messenger of stem cells) to trigger the regeneration of tissue, which, as we continue to make advancements in this field, can in essence lead us in the future to prevent disease before we even get sick.

ISAPS: At the Athens Olympiad World Congress last year, you presented a session on regenerative surgery, stem cells, and exosomes. How have these advancements influenced the aesthetic surgery specialty? What changes do you anticipate in the next few years regarding regenerative surgery?

SCHLAUDRAFF: ISAPS has the capability of being the leading authority and society in the regenerative field. We are learning to use stem cells to treat injuries as well as prevent further injury, by protecting tissue from additional damage. Because of these advancements, we are starting to see a shift toward preventative measures (rather than corrective measures), and regenerating tissue instead of reconstructing parts of the body. Through our work as a Society, we can advance this concept and evolve the technology needed to make considerable impacts in this field. I see the future for our specialty being less about surgery and more about minimally invasive and regenerative procedures.

ISAPS: You are not only ISAPS Treasurer, but also a Committee Member of the Finance, Investment, and Industry Relations Committee. Describe your connection

and association with various industry partners, and why they should collaborate with ISAPS.

SCHLAUDRAFF: It is important to see the connection between the financial and industry perspectives and be aware of the influence ISAPS has in our specialty, particularly in education. We must work together to execute new research and products in a controlled, unbiased environment. An example of this collaboration is the Global Sponsorship Program. ISAPS is a multicultural society and provides an environment where diverse cultures can work together to create standards of good medical practice based on many different backgrounds; it is not one-sided but a multi-faceted approach. ISAPS offers a sense of cultural unity which is reflective of our collaboration with our partners.

ISAPS: In your role as Treasurer for an international society such as ISAPS, you must encounter many intricacies. What challenges do you face when negotiating the cultural diversity of your colleagues? How do you overcome them?

**SCHLAUDRAFF:** It is as much about cultural diversity and expectations as it is about ISAPS as a big family.

For me, it is equally important to keep membership and congress fees low as it is to invest in innovative ways of education. In the last 10 years, ISAPS has set a standard for education with its strategic investments in the current educational offers. Now, I believe we must establish a vision for the next 10-20 years and prepare for the transition from the current way of organizing education to a world organized by artificial intelligence and social media.

I believe we shall work on a consensus on how to best invest directly in the countries in need of education, and establish new ways of teaching via remote platforms, AI, and other educational initiatives.

My prerogative is that ISAPS funds belong to the membership, and as the Board of Directors, we are only stewards of these funds and must ensure that they are invested wisely.

ISAPS: Now our focus has shifted to this year's ISAPS World Congress 2024, Cartagena, Colombia. What are you most looking forward to?

SCHLAUDRAFF: I have visited Colombia on several occasions and look forward to returning and experiencing its rich culture. Seeing friends, sharing knowledge, and exchanging differing cultural views, and allowing us to use this to provide the best results for our patients. As an international society, we can take the best practices from throughout the world and share them among friends - this is the real wealth of ISAPS. This diversity is what allows ISAPS to excel over national societies; with our many participating countries and members of varying ages, we can promote different ideas and build a consensus to support everyone's views.

And that is what I look forward to in Cartagena.




# Recently published in **Aesthetic Plastic Surgery...**

Sensory Changes in Nasal Subunits Following Open and Closed Rhinoplasty:

A Randomized Controlled Trial

Nasal subunits: Nasion (N), Rhinion (R), Tip (T), Left Alar Wing (LA), Right Alar Wing (RA), Infratip Lobule (IL), Columellar Base (CB)

Skin sensation changes are common after rhinoplasty and can be troublesome for patients postoperatively. The closed technique may be considered as causing less sensory loss compared to the open technique due to its conservative approach, minimal dissection and low tissue damage potential. A randomized study was planned to compare the sensory changes in the subunits of the nasal skin caused by the two main methods using objective and subjective parameters.


