Interview with **Dr. Renato Saltz,** ISAPS Board of Directors, Trustee, and his Insights on The Ohmori Lecture

ISAPS is pleased to introduce you to our 2022 distinguished Ohmori Lecture presenter, Renato Saltz, MD, Past-President of ISAPS (2016-2018). He shares below a glimpse of “The Tripod of Fulfillment” that he will be presenting during the Ohmori Lecture: What has motivated his successful professional career and what challenges people to find purpose and fulfillment in their own lives.

ISAPS: You are this year’s distinguished presenter of the Ohmori Lecture. What has been your inspiration for achieving such high success as a surgeon and as a leader of the International Society (ISAPS) and your own national society The Aesthetic Society formerly known as the American Society for Aesthetic Plastic Surgery (ASAPS)?

Saltz: I am grateful to have been selected for this honor and the opportunity to share my story with my colleagues. There are three areas that inspire me, which represent my ‘Tripod of Fulfillment’: patients, service, and teaching. My work with ISAPS over the last several decades has enabled me to continuously elevate my patients’ care, serve our society and my community, and teach colleagues in our specialty. Outside of ISAPS, I have dedicated my professional life to serving my patients and local community. I founded The Image Reborn Foundation, a non-profit organization, over 25 years ago, to provide breast cancer survivors with retreats to help them heal inside and out. As an adjunct professor at the University of Utah, I mentor and train plastic surgery residents on a regular basis, hosting them in my practice for their training and education in Aesthetic Surgery.

ISAPS: What ISAPS principles and standards have influenced you over the years, and how have they supported you in your Ohmori Lecture achievement?

Saltz: ISAPS has enabled me to work with my

colleagues to achieve amazing things for our specialty and patients. Together we have placed education and patient safety on the forefront of the global agenda, which has raised awareness of key issues. ISAPS has also taught me about the importance of collaboration and working together to grow. We are a diverse society with members all over the world, and amid all our differences we still work together. I consider the Ohmori Lecture such a distinguished honor that embodies the true diversity and many nationalities that make up our society. I believe the Ohmori Lecture allows us the opportunity to reflect on our morals, ethics, and the values that bring our society together.

ISAPS: As the presenter of the Ohmori Lecture, you have exhibited a high level of achievement and contribution to aesthetic plastic surgery. What advice do you have for the younger generation of plastic surgeons?

Saltz: Work hard. I am a firm believer that through hard work and persistence, you can achieve many things. I hope that I can influence the next generation of surgeons to discover their own ‘Tripod of Fulfillment’, so they too can serve in our society and help us reach new heights in the future.

ISAPS: When you present your Ohmori Lecture at the ISAPS World Congress in Istanbul this September, what, briefly, can we expect to hear you speak about?

Saltz: During my Ohmori Lecture, I will be sharing the three areas that truly shaped my career and continue to inspire me every day. My ‘Tripod of Fulfillment’ is comprised of:

- 1. PATIENTS:** Patient safety and education has been a priority in my practice and my life. I am a firm believer if we do not reinvent ourselves and learn the latest innovations, we become obsolete specially in the field of Aesthetics. For example, non-surgical

procedures are perceived very differently today than 20 years ago, when such an idea was preposterous to a surgeon. It is also important to be aware of the disruption and how quickly these changes can happen. In our specialty, we must stay up-to-date and innovate, innovate, innovate.

2. SERVICE: As many of you know from working with me, I have been a strong advocate of Servant Leadership in ISAPS and other societies where I have the privilege to serve. This sense of service is also reflected in how I lead in my practice, community, and other aspects of my life. There is nothing more gratifying and rewarding than to serve! I firmly believe really, and truly happy people are those who have sought and found how to serve.

3. TEACHING: It is so rewarding to teach younger, aspiring surgeons. I think this is because through

education we continue to find meaning and purpose in our profession. I am energized by working with the next generation, they inspire me to continue to evolve and innovate. Teaching also allows me to interact and learn from my diverse, exceptional colleagues.

Placing patients first, practicing, and innovating aesthetic surgery, teaching and fostering education, all by serving others represent the tripod that fulfills my professional life.

I am grateful for and humbled by the honor to present the distinguished Ohmori Lecture on Thursday, September 22 at 5 pm during the Opening Ceremonies at the ISAPS World Congress in Istanbul.

Do You Have a Reliable & Responsive Patient Care Communication Structure in Place?

Having a busy practice is a good problem to have, but if you are not responding in a timely manner to patient requests and needs, you could be missing out on revenue, and perhaps even referrals.

The Fundamentals

We all know the basics of client relations, but are we really following through with the fundamentals? It is as simple as answering incoming requests in a timely manner, whether that be by phone or online. Our clients today want information quickly and with little hassle. To make their interaction with your practice more seamless means less time on hold to reach someone who can assist them, or not having to sift through your website to find online response choices.

Options

Luckily with technological advancements, we have much more to choose from in terms of

what type of communication process we want to implement. It can be as simple as hiring a third party to help your front office staff answer incoming calls or hiring an outside web-based company to host an online platform. 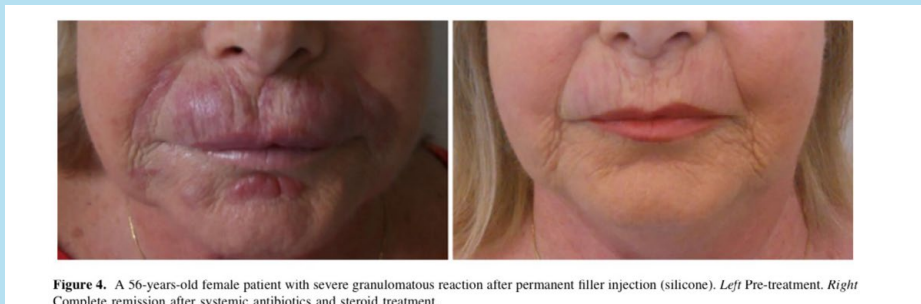


Figure 4. A 56-years-old female patient with severe granulomatous reaction after permanent filler injection (silicone). *Left* Pre-treatment. *Right* Complete remission after systemic antibiotics and steroid treatment.

Clinical Management of Complications Following Filler Injection

This article provides an overview of dermal filler injections, and how they are classified as minimally invasive procedures. In the last decade, American Society of Plastic Surgery (ASPS) has collected data showing a significant increase in minimally invasive cosmetic procedures, principally focused on facial rejuvenation. The number of these procedures was up to 174% when comparing the data obtained from 2020 with those of 2000. In particular, 3.4 million of soft tissue injections were practiced in 2020.¹
