

Quick Facts: Highlights of the ISAPS 2015 Statistics on Cosmetic Surgery



- There were more than 21 million surgical and nonsurgical cosmetic procedures performed worldwide in 2015, an increase of over 1 million reported cosmetic procedures from 2014.
- Botulinum Toxin, (including BOTOX® Dysport and Xeomin) was ranked the most popular cosmetic procedure overall.
- The United States held the top spot for total number of surgical procedures performed.
- The top five countries which performed the most surgical and nonsurgical procedures were the United States, Brazil, South Korea, India and Mexico.
- 9.6 million surgical procedures were performed in 2015.
- The cosmetic surgical procedures performed most frequently were:
 - Breast Augmentation (up 10% vs. 2014)
 - Liposuction (up 2% vs. 2014)
 - Eyelid Surgery (down 11% vs. 2014)
 - Abdominoplasty (up 11% vs. 2014)
- Increases were also reported for breast lifts and ear surgery in 2015
 - Breast Lift (512,248 vs. 498, 957 in 2014)
 - Ear Surgery (252, 718 vs. 247, 518 in 2014)
- The United States accounted for 14.7%, Brazil for 12.7%, Mexico for 4.8%, South Korea for 4.6%, and India for 4.4% of the surgical procedures.

- 12.1 million nonsurgical procedures were performed in 2015 with the United States taking the lead at 2.6 million procedures.
- The nonsurgical procedures performed most often in 2015 were:
 - Botulinum Toxin (down 4% vs. 2014)
 - Hyaluronic Acid (up 7% vs. 2014)
 - Hair Removal (down 14% vs. 2014)
 - Photo Rejuvenation (new to 2015 survey)
 - Nonsurgical Fat Reduction (new to 2015 survey)
- The United States accounted for 21.8%, Brazil for 9.1%, South Korea for 5.9%, India for 4.3% and Mexico for 3.7% of the total nonsurgical procedures.
- Women had more than 18 million surgical and nonsurgical procedures, 85.6% of the total. The top five surgical procedures performed on women in 2015 were: breast augmentation, liposuction, eyelid surgery, abdominoplasty, and rhinoplasty.
- The United States accounted for 19.6%, Brazil for 12.9%, Mexico for 4%, Germany for 3.6% and France for 3.1% of the total number of breast procedures performed worldwide in 2014.
- Men had more than 3 million surgical and nonsurgical procedures, 14.4% of the total. The top five surgical procedures performed on men in 2015 were: eyelid surgery, liposuction, gynecomastia, rhinoplasty, fat grafting and ear surgery.

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
