

1. Membership - Growth, Retention, and Worldwide Representation


I want to share a few noteworthy updates: in 2024, we added 1,471 new members, reaching the highest-ever number of members at 5,612. Of these, 3,572 are paying members, another milestone for ISAPS.

Our demographics cross many borders, with the USA (408), Brazil (348), Mexico (346), India (287), and Turkiye (285) being the top five countries with more than 100 members. Germany, Pakistan, and Italy follow closely.

Of our <u>Resident</u> members, 36% are from Pakistan, making it the leading country with 226 ISAPS residents. I am also amazed at the impressive growth of countries like Turkiye, Argentina, Iran, India, Malaysia, South Korea, and Bangladesh.

Mexico has the highest number of paying members, followed by the USA, Brazil, and India.

I want to express my personal gratitude to everyone involved, including Richard Guy, Head of Membership Services, and Dr. Fabian Cortiñas, Chair of the Membership Committee and BoD Member. I want to especially recognize our National Secretaries' army, whose hard work and dedication made it possible to achieve these outstanding results.




2. Abstracts for Singapore - by Topic and Country

3. New Generation ISAPS Members Focus Group - Terms of Reference (ToR)

As you may know, our Society has different levels of control and rules, which are overseen by our Corporate Governance and Policy Committee. These are outlined in the ISAPS Bylaws, ToR's, and further agreed-upon policies. To ensure the proper execution of the Society's functionalities in different areas like finance, education, membership, communications, and patient safety, to mention a few, we recently reviewed these policies during the last Board of Directors Meeting, where we unanimously approved the ToR for the NEW GENERATION ISAPS MEMBERS FOCUS GROUP, presented by the Chairman of the Governance and Policy Committee, Dr. Gustavo Abrile, and Board Member from Argentina.

Considering that 36% of our membership are residents, we saw the necessity of creating this specific task force in ISAPS to care for them immediately after they finish their training as plastic surgeons and during the first five years of practice. ISAPS New Generation of Surgeons Focus Group Terms of Reference

1. PURPOSE

1.1 Purpose of the New Generation of Surgeons Focus Group

The ISAPS New Generation of Surgeons Focus Group ("Committee" hereinafter) is intended to develop a network of plastic surgeons who graduated in plastic surgery less than five years ago, to help ISAPS increase and develop dialogue, mentoring and the conditions to stimulate and develop leadership among newly-qualified surgeons. As a network group, participation is open to all ISAPS Associate or Active members within 5 years post qualification and to final year Resident. The mandate of the Committee is to consider, and recommend to the relevant committees of the ISAPS Board of Directors (BoD), activities for the above purpose.

4. Brazilian Society of Plastic Surgery (SBCP) Annual Meeting, Brazil - an ISAPS Global Alliance Partner

Interview with Naveen Cavale, MD

Board Member and Chair of Communications, Branding, and Public Relations Committee

We are delighted to introduce you to **Dr. Naveen Cavale, Board Member and Chair of the ISAPS Communications, Branding, and Public Relations Committee (2024-2026)**, which advises the Board of Directors (BoD) on all matters relating to the Society's communications, including public relations, marketing, website, and branding. Please read on to learn more about Dr. Cavale – his views, his involvement within the specialty, and what ISAPS represents.

ISAPS: Your involvement with ISAPS includes everything from being the UK Assistant and National Secretary to extensive participation in the Membership and Communications Committees, serving as the Chair of the ISAPS Social Media Committee, and now as a Board Member and Chair of the Communications, Branding, and Public Relations Committee.

What does it mean for you to be such an active part of the #ISAPSFamily? What are your goals for these roles?

CAVALE: ISAPS is probably my favorite "plastics society," mainly because it is so cosmopolitan. We have members from all over the world, and the great thing about plastics is that people are working on all the different parts of the body. This means you always meet someone interesting at an ISAPS conference, course, symposium etc.

ISAPS: One key achievement of ISAPS' communication strategy under your leadership as Social Media Committee Chair has been the introduction of Instagram Lives. What motivated this initiative, and what can we expect next?

CAVALE: Insta Lives are great in general, and they became particularly popular during COVID lockdowns. They are informal and nowhere near as 'polished' as a lot of social media these days. So, people watching

(correctly) feel they are getting a true representation of our specialty. This makes them much less intimidating, and as a result, engagement seems to have been great. I'm really hoping to make them 'bigger and better' with more ISAPS National Secretaries hosting them as well as "guests." If this works, we will also look to the broader membership to get involved.

ISAPS: What is your perception of our specialty's impact on social media? Adversely, what is the role of social media in our specialty?

CAVALE: I think social media is simply the newest form of communication, so I don't regard it any differently from the telephone, TV, email, paper mail, or even pigeon-post! So, we cannot ignore it and pretend it doesn't exist. Everyone is on there. But it is a rapid and quickly reactive form of communication, instantly "public," and very permanent (once you say something on social media, there is no way to delete it, as someone will have taken a screenshot, etc.), so this makes it very powerful, potentially dangerous, and open to abuse. As we know, and to quote Spiderman, "With great power, comes great responsibility," so it is so important for respected organizations such as ISAPS to make sure they are using social media, but also to set an example of how to do it ethically, safely and honestly.

ISAPS: International Men's Day is November 19. According to the ISAPS Global Survey, the top three procedures for men in 2023 were eyelid surgery, gynecomastia, and liposuction.

What are the primary obstacles for men when considering aesthetic plastic surgery, in your opinion?

CAVALE: The stigma associated with aesthetic surgery is reducing, but I think this is taking longer for men. For example, it took ages for men to accept that skincare

and sun protection are good things, but these are now almost universally accepted - nearly every man I know now uses moisturizer! The same is happening with surgery, but we will get there. At the moment, fewer than 15 percent of aesthetic procedures are performed on men. One day, this will be 50%, I am sure.

ISAPS: We can't wait for the ISAPS Olympiad World Congress in Singapore next June! With over 800 abstracts submitted, what topics are you most interested in, and why are they important? What are you looking forward to in Singapore, and why is ISAPS 2025 a Congress that plastic surgeons should not miss?

CAVALE: I am interested in everything at the Singapore Olympiad! It's the variety that makes it special. So, even if it is a session in an area that I don't work in, I will visit - and I always end up learning a new trick or two by doing so. My main interest is in noses and faces (as well as breasts, but this seems to be reducing in my practice), so I will visit those sessions, too.

In addition, I will definitely take advantage of being in Southeast Asia by visiting somewhere like Vietnam, Malaysia, or Cambodia!

A Three-Dimensional Approach To Male Chest Enhancement:
A Surgical Algorithm Based On 300 Cases

Gynecomastia is defined as a benign condition of the male caused by tissue overgrowth (Blau and Hazani in Plast Reconstruct Surg 135 (2): 425-432, 2015). Its incidence ranges widely in the world population, ranging from 32 to 65% (Innocenti et al. in Ann Plast Surg 78 (5): 492-496, 2017). Pseudogynecomastia is a condition characterized by deposits of adipose tissue with alteration of the profile of the male thorax. It appears clinically similar to gynecomastia (Hoyos et al. in Plast Reconstr Surg 147:1072-1083, 2021). Several classification systems that characterize the severity of male breast hypertrophy have been described in the literature, and many surgical algorithms have been formulated for its treatment (Holzmer et al. in Plast Reconstruct Surg-Global Open 8:e3161,2020).



MONTHLY EDUCATION CORNER

The purpose of this original article is to provide a comprehensive surgical algorithm for the management of male chest enhancement based on severity, as defined by the Moschella scale (Tambasco et al. in J Plast Reconstruct Aesthet Surg 90:99-100, 2024). A total of 300 patients treated for bilateral breast hypertrophy are included and reviewed in this retrospective study. Patients have been diversified according to the Moschella scale.



"Surgical techniques for enhancing the male abdomen include both autologous and implant-based methods. Power-assisted suction lipectomy of the abdomen can selectively outline the abdominal musculature by creating depressions at the outlines of the rectus abdominis, abdominal obliques, serratus anterior, and inguinal furrow while also removing excess adipose tissue."




